# 6.0 Recent Achievements, Activities, Output Indicators, Targets and Expenditure Estimates of the Departments/Agencies

### 6.1 Economic Relations Division (ERD)

6.1.1 Recent Achievements: In FY 2021-22, disbursement of the foreign aid raised to US\$ 10,969.29 million. In the previous two years, i.e. FY 2019-20 and 2020-21, disbursements totalled US\$ 7,381.00 million and 7,957.56 million respectively. In FY 2021-22, foreign assistance agreements have been signed amounting US\$ 10,173.24 million. Moreover, during the previous two years i.e., 2019-20 and 2020-21, foreign assistance agreements have been signed amounting US\$ 9,797.00 million and 9,442.37 million respectively. A total of 105 agreements were signed in FY 2021-22 for mobilizing external resources, of which 71 were for grants and the remaining 34 were for loans. In FY 2020-21, 106 agreements were signed of which 70 were for grants and 36 were for loans.
